What has the minister been doing through the month of January?

Sadly, from during the festive period and into the new year, there have been a number of funerals, and this naturally takes precedence in terms of my time. Please pray for those who have been bereaved as they adjust to life without their loved one.

I like to plan ahead if possible and so I draft outline services for Sundays until the end of February, this year following Mark's Gospel as our focus. This gives me good time to think about and plan sermons and worship in general from week to week.

I have continued to assist the Presbytery as we remain without a full-time Clerk, however as I write we are about to interview for the post, so I remain hopeful that we will appoint soon. I have prepared for and led a Business Committee meeting at our Presbytery Hamilton office as we prepare for our next full Presbytery meeting in Motherwell at the start of February. I am also the Interim Moderator for Airth Church for the purposes of any meeting in connection with their forthcoming union with several of the Larbert Churches. I preached and clerked at the service of union for the newly united Grangemouth Parkview Church.

We are now without Charlene Condeco as our assistant minister as she has moved to be a Locum – we thank Charlene for her time with us and all that she has shared in worship and care and wish her every blessing for her future ministry.

Wednesday Worship has resumed and I aim to do at least two per month and I am pleased to say that Catherine Smith and Norah Summers will lead Wednesday Worship approximately once per month.

I have led our monthly worship service at Burnbrae Nursing Home and it is great to have the support of several members attending with me to boost the singing and make friendships with the residents. I am a Trustee of the Dawson Trust – which only means one annual meeting – that took place in January and at that meeting we agree on funding to various charities from the Trust, amounting to nearly £50,000.

I share these just to give you a flavour of what my ministry involves. We live in challenging times for the Kirk through great change and ministry itself is evolving and changing too. I remain thankful that here at Falkirk Trinity we are committed to the ministry of all God's people and that we work together in partnership to engage in outreach, share worship, and to care for one another. As the apostle Paul would say, together we are the body of Christ, each with gifts to play our part. We give thanks to God for his Spirit which strengthens and enables us to build his Church.

We are thinking about new ways to fundraise to raise money for Christian Aid's projects. Any ideas welcome!

FAIR TRADE At the start of December I visited Bangladesh with my son.

The weekend I arrived, in the park beside our apartment, there were craft stalls and I was able to buy directly from a group of women who were part of a cooperative in their village making and embroidering small items such as book marks and make-up bags. There is also a fairtrade shop in the centre of Daka selling a wide range of fair trade goods which we visited and bought gifts to take home.

I missed Traidcraft at Christmas! I always enjoyed buying their Christmas cards and finding small gifts for friends in their catalogue. There is, however, an organisation called Transform Trade based in Newcastle. They work for trade and climate justice.

In South Asia and East Africa, they partner with farmers, workers and artisans to help them benefit from more sustainable and equitable trade. From supporting tea growers in Asia and East Africa, to standing with smallholder farmers, garment makers and continuing to invest directly in producer businesses fighting for a fairer deal, Transform Trade hope their work will continue to grow and expand this year.

In the UK Transform Trade advocate and campaign for changes to business practices and government policy. And here's the good news for some members of our congregation . . . you can buy Traidcraft loo roll from them now at store-transform-trade.org

You can also buy greetings cards and Christmas cards.

An alternative is the One World Shop and café in the church at the foot of Lothian Road in Edinburgh.


Stamp appeal
