Any children and teenagers are welcome , including any who have not joined us before!



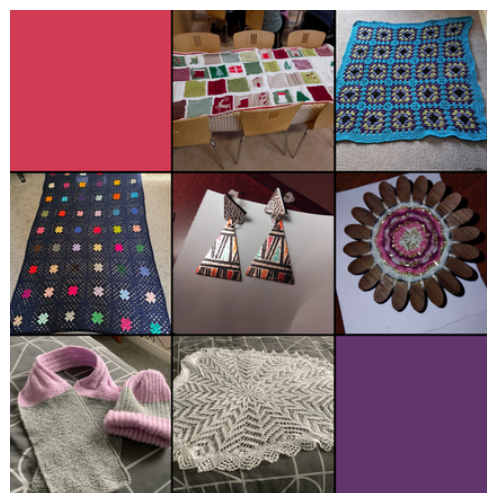
March
