

Worship Guidelines at Falkirk Trinity: January 2022 update

1. Worship will be at the Church building on Sundays at 10.30am, lasting for approximately 45 minutes. The Church of Scotland strongly urges congregations to continue to take a note of names and contact numbers of those attending to assist with track and trace, therefore you will be asked to do this on arrival at Church – alternatively, the easier way to check-in and out is by using our QR code which can be scanned using your mobile phone on entry and exit to the Church.
2. Wednesday Worship takes place at the Church on Wednesdays at 11.30am for 20-25 minutes. On entry to Church a hymn book can be uplifted and then returned to the same box afterwards. Again, contact name and number will be required.
3. There will be no tea/coffee after worship until further notice.
4. No one with any Covid-19 symptoms or other contagious health conditions should attend. Please be aware of the latest Scottish Government guidelines and consider carefully whether or not you should attend.
5. All attending Church must wear a face covering at all times; there will be no pew leaflets or other items to collect; access to the balcony is possible for a small number of people; singing is allowed as long as face coverings are worn and, for the time being, the choir will also sing using face coverings.
6. Scottish Government guidance advises keeping a physical distance between households, therefore please keep a 1m safe distance from people in other households.
7. Church Officer will arrive 45 minutes before the service, double check that all safety and hygiene measures are in place, and make suitable arrangements to maintain good ventilation.
8. We aim to resume live streaming at some point later in the year. More volunteers willing to train in computers/livestreaming would be helpful. Online worship will continue every week.
9. At the close of worship please take your time to leave the sanctuary to avoid crowding.
10. Youth Station and S-Kidz will resume if leaders/young people wish to do so, following current regulations.
11. We would politely remind everyone to be respectful of the fact that people may wish to remain cautious and therefore it is important that we all follow these guidelines. We are aware that the virus remains a threat and care still needs to be taken.
